



More About Ancil Hoffman Golf Course

Ancil Hoffman Golf Course is located in Ancil Hoffman Park next to the American River in Carmichael, California. The County of Sacramento purchased the 397 acres of open parkland, previously called San Juan Meadows, from the heirs of Mary Deterding in 1960 and named it Ancil Hoffman County Park. This property was part of the original Rancho San Juan Spanish Land Grant. Mrs. Deterding purchased the property on 1907.

The golf course was designed by William Bell and opened for play on May 15, 1965. A long-time Sacramento favorite, the course has an outstanding layout with mature trees and rolling terrain.

The facility includes a fully stocked golf shop, a restaurant with a full service bar, a tournament room in the clubhouse and the Ancil Hoffman Trophy Room, which is available for rental by golf and non-golf organizations. The golf course has a driving range, two practice putting greens and a practice bunker. Ancil Hoffman Golf Course offers an adaptive golf cart for golfers with disabilities and provides training to assist these special customers.

The Golf Shop provides complete golf services that include full service club fitting and club building. Lessons are offered to golfers of all ages and skill levels from the highly qualified teaching staff that is headed by Eric Pollard, one of the top teaching professionals in the Sacramento area.

The Ancil Hoffman Golf Shop is managed by Empire Golf, Inc. for the County of Sacramento under a Professional Management Services Agreement that includes all Golf Shop operations. The Ancil Hoffman Restaurant is operated by Food Services Specialists Inc. under a concession lease agreement.
