- **Other Incidents**

- On December 13, 2018, the Park Resource Team coordinated a warrant sweep in the area of Bannon Island and the Two Rivers Trail. Rangers were joined by Sacramento County Sheriff deputies, Sacramento County Probation officers, California State Parole officers, and a Sacramento County Animal Control officer. The enforcement teams contacted over 40 people in the Bannon Island area. 14 people were arrested for active misdemeanor arrest warrants. 1 subject was arrested for possession of methamphetamine. The enforcement teams located an individual that Sacramento Police were looking for regarding a burglary investigation, so that suspect was turned over to detectives from Sacramento

Police. Enforcement teams contacted approximately 100 people on the Two Rivers Trail. 21 people were arrested for active misdemeanor warrants. 3 people were arrested for possession of methamphetamine, 1 person was arrested for a felony violation of probation and 1 person was arrested for a felony violation of being out of compliance as a sex offender. In addition, enforcement teams arrested a parole at large (felony) and 1 person for a felony domestic violence felony case. They were able to get the victim to the hospital for non-life threatening facial injuries. In total, there were 40 misdemeanor arrests made and 4 felony arrests. Animal control confiscated 16 dogs.

- Rangers responded to Ancil Hoffman Park on a report that a vehicle was doing “donuts” on a grass field. Rangers caught the individual responsible. The person did significant damage to the turf in the field. The person was arrested for vandalism and we will seek restitution for the damage.
- The Park Resource Teams have also worked with Department of Human Assistance this year dealing with homeless individuals. Through December 15, 2018, Rangers referred 32 people to DHA. 12 of the 32 have been moved into permanent housing. 16 of the 32 remain in the shelter working on housing, and 4 have exited the program back onto the street. The Rangers have enjoyed a good working relationship with DHA working with the county approved homeless initiatives.
