#### • Other Incidents

- Rangers continue to enforce narcotic violations. In the month of January they arrested one person for possession for sales of methamphetamine. Rangers recovered 49.19 grams of methamphetamine during the month of January.
- A person was fishing in the American River by mile marker 6.5. While he was fishing, someone stolen several items of fishing equipment. When the man was leaving, he located some of his stolen property inside a homeless encampment. Rangers are still investigating this case.
- Rangers responded to Camp Pollock regarding a burglary to one of their buildings. A video captured a group of teens originally breaking into the building, but they did not appear to steal anything. A second video shows an individual entering the building and stealing items.
- Ranger also investigated a series of auto burglaries at the Olive Avenue access, Rangers are following up on all of these cases.

We have clarified and narrowed our definition of a camp cleaned and removed. Our goal is to reflect a more accurate number of actual camps that were cleared from Regional Park property. The garbage collection criteria will remain the same. Our statistical data over time was combining some information. For example, our maintenance staff removes garbage from our Parks which is known to come from homeless encampments, some of which is bagged by the homeless which was recorded as a camp cleaned. That data will be captured in the number of tons of garbage removed from Parks; however, if the camp was not removed and remained in the same location, it will not be counted as a camp cleaned and removed. I believe that reporting camps cleaned and removed using this criteria will provide a much more accurate number homeless encampments removed.
